## MY TIME AT ADATH ISRAEL





The Annual Meeting of the Congregation will be held on **Sunday, June 4** at **9:30 a.m.** in the Social Hall.



# JEWISH WAR VETERANS JUNE 4 SPECIAL MEETING 50<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF THE SIX-DAY WAR IN THE MIDDLE EAST

Jewish War Veterans of the U.S.A., Major General Maurice Rose Post 51, will meet on Sunday, June 4, 11:30 am, at Congregation Adath Israel in the Nester Center in Middletown. All veterans, whether they served in war or peace time, are invited. Brunch will be served.

The program will be a film, Six Days in June, on the war that redefined the Middle East.

Although the fighting lasted for only six days in June of 1967, the effects are still apparent today. For Israel, the 1967 war was a military success. It also redrew the map of the Middle East and mired the region in a cycle of occupation, terrorism and reprisal. The Six Day War changed the politics of the Middle East. It gave rise to a Palestinian nationalist movement and helped unleash the fury of fundamentalism. Shot on location in Israel, Palestine, Egypt, Syria, Jordan, Moscow and Washington, this powerful film moves through the weeks that preceded the war, the six days of fighting, and the aftermath that still lingers today.
