I recognize many of my president's columns over the past year have focused on the merger with Temple B'Nai Abraham.

The merger became effective on July 1, 2019, and it is my pleasure to officially welcome all of those from Temple B'Nai Abraham to Congregation Adath Israel. We are now one congregation! Thank you to the Boards of both congregations, the Temple B'Nai Abraham merger committee and all those who made this possible.

As I mentioned in my column last year at this time, I have always found the High Holiday season as a time to reflect back on the past year and look forward to what the future may hold. This year I am largely looking forward. While a great deal of work went into the merger this past year, the work is just beginning.

This work began this summer as we merged the business sides of things. The work will be ongoing, but we cannot forget to celebrate this milestone in our history. It represents a new beginning for all of us. The first celebration occurred on June 30 when we joined together as a family and walked the Temple B'Nai Abraham Torahs from Meriden to their new home at Adath Israel. Third, in the coming weeks, construction will begin in the main sanctuary as the Meriden ark is incorporated into the sanctuary. The installation of the ark will both beautify our sanctuary and symbolize the merger of our communities into one.

Finally, we must find a rabbi that will serve our congregation. While we were disappointed the rabbi search this past year was not successful, we are committed to finding a rabbi that is right for our congregation. We will not settle for anything but the right fit. In the meantime, we are fortunate to have Rabbi Press and Rabbi Kohn share in the rabbinical responsibilities during the next year. They will work with the board, the ritual committee and each other to ensure a smooth transition.

I am sure challenges lay ahead in the upcoming year. I ask that you rise with us as one congregation to meet the challenge and start a new beginning for Adath Israel.

WHAT'S IN A NAME -

The way the Jewish people choose names follows the law and tradition that prevailed in the areas where we lived. A boy was usually named at the time of his Bris. The Bris was done on the eighth day unless there was a medical reason and then the time could be extended. A girl was usually named at the first Torah reading after her birth.

The names were often after a deceased relative. The name was referred as the child of the father, ie. Benyomin the son of Chaim for a boy or Channah the daughter of Chaim, (if the father is not Jewish, the mothers name is used). This tradition was the way our children were named for generations and is still followed today by many.

This format is used when someone is given an Aliyah (called to the Torah). The format is also used when we say the prayer for recovery from an illness. Therefore, if we ask to pray for someone who is ill, we should try our best to follow our traditional format by using the person's Jewish name (if in fact they are Jewish.)

High Holy Days Seating at Adath Israel

As the summer winds down thoughts turn to the High Holy Days. Already the Seating Committee is hard at work to ensure that all who wish to attend services have a spot. With many new members joining us this year, we thought it would be a perfect time to review how seating works at Adath Israel.

Seating at Adath Israel is assigned.

Existing members are assigned the seats they held last year unless they contact the office to change. If you are an existing member and need to adjust the number of seats you need for the coming year or their location, please contact the office.

If you are a new member, no seats will be assigned to you unless you contact the office and request them. Please be sure to let us know the number of seats you need and if anyone in your party has special needs.

Seats are not included in your membership contribution.

New members receive complimentary seats equal to the number of members listed on their membership application for the first year. Additional seats are \$50/seat for the season. Existing members are charged \$50/seat.

How to find your seat.

In the foyer of the Main Sanctuary will be maps of each floor with the member family's name indicating each seat. Ushers will be waiting to help you find your spot(s). In addition each seat has a name tag.

We do not issue paper tickets.

Instead we use your name on the map.

Adath Israel honors reciprocal seating.

Guests who are members in good standing at a synagogue and contribute toward High Holy Days seating either through direct payment or as part of their membership contribution are welcome to join us as at no additional cost. Please contact the office for details.


