RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING ALL POST SECONDARY SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS FOR

CHILDREN OF CONGREGATION ADATH ISRAEL MEMBERS

- 1. The following considerations will guide the Committee in selection of recipients:
 - A. Need
 - B. <u>Scholastic achievement</u> and submission of High School or College transcript and a <u>current</u> letter of recommendation from a school administrator, advisor, councilor, etc,
 - Character present a <u>current</u> letter of reference from acquaintance, employer other than member of family or this committee.(not educational related)
 - D. <u>Extra-curricular activities</u> list on application form your activities and specific involvement beyond just a member both in the general and Jewish community at home and at school.
 - E. <u>Essay</u> discussing your intended course of study (major) and how you plan to apply it to your future endeavors.
- Applicant must be accepted and attend an accredited college, university, or school of higher learning.
- Parents must be a member in good standing of Congregation Adath Israel for a minimum of three consecutive years, including prior membership at Temple B'nai Abraham, prior to the date of application.
- Scholarship applications <u>must</u> be accompanied by the first page of the parent's (parents')
 Federal income tax form, if applicant is claimed as a dependent.
- Completed applications should be postmarked or delivered to Congregation Adath Israel by May 15, 2020.

HANNA PERLSTEIN MARCUS was born at the Bergen Belsen displaced persons camp after World War II and later immigrated to Springfield, Massachusetts with her mother, Sidonia. She is a licensed clinical social worker in Connecticut and a former model of her mother's clothing designs.

Her first book, *Sidonia's Thread*, has been read around the world and was the winner of the Readers' Favorite 2018 Gold Medal for memoir, the 2014 Best Kindle Book Award for nonfiction and was nominated for the Sophie Brody Medal of the American Library Association and the Sarton Memoir Prize, as well as a semi-finalist for the BookLife Prize.

Her second book in a planned trilogy is *Surviving Remnant*, nominated for a Readers' Choice Award, which describes her upbringing in a community of Holocaust survivors in Springfield's North End and her hapless search for a father figure among them.

Marcus' books are filled with love, resilience, courage, and humor and portray an intimate and richly rewarding story of the struggle for life among new refugees in America and a singular mother and daughter bond from the ashes of the Holocaust. She has been called "one of the best lecturers [about a post-Holocaust life] of her generation."




