For the times they are a-changin'







HANNA PERLSTEIN MARCUS was born at the Bergen Belsen displaced persons camp after World War II and later emigrated to Springfield, Massachusetts with her mother, Sidonia. She is a licensed clinical social worker in Connecticut and also designs her mother's clothing designs.

Her first book, *Sidonia*, was published around the world and was the winner of the 2014 PEN Award for Best Nonfiction, the 2014 Pulitzer Prize for nonfiction and was nominated for the 2015 National Book Award. It was also a finalist for the American Library Association and the BookLife Prize.

Her second book, *Surviving Remnant*, nominated for a Readers' Choice Award, which tells the story of her mother's life in a community of Holocaust survivors in Springfield's North End and her relationship with her father figure among them.

Marcus' books are filled with love, resilience, courage, and humor and portray an intimate and richly rewarding story of the struggle for life among new refugees in America and a singular mother and daughter bond from the ashes of the Holocaust. She has been called "one of the best lecturers [about a post-Holocaust life] of her generation."
