believe that looking and reviewing our past, renewing and re-energizing our present, will transform and grow our future. And this year, we have a lot to come to grips with – both our growth and our positive experiences, and our negative and difficult experiences, at home and abroad.

Rabbi Alan Lew z"l compares the High Holidays with taking leave from the world, going into a vacation of sorts. What happens when we go away on vacation? We are able to look back at our lives and see them anew, and when we come back, we make adjustments, sometimes even unconsciously.

The same happens to us when we take the High Holidays for what they are: a time to stop and review our spiritual lives. Why look back? Why reflect? Lives, to ripen and bring light to one another, need the space and the time for self-reflection. It is only when we pause and see our lives as compared with great visions that we can search for our own way of making meaning of our existence. Rosh HaShanah is part of that process, one that is supposed to begin with Tisha B'Av and end with Sukkot.

Both Tisha B'Av and Sukkot revolve around structures: one that was permanent and disappeared, and one that is impermanent but rebuilt every year, dependable, full of joy and light. Every year we are supposed to embark in this time of checking the structures, boundaries, thought processes that are not helpful anymore, and after the sometimes excruciating process of shedding them, finding the courage and the energy to construct new ones.

This year, however, brings a new challenge – the inclusion of October 7th in this process. Not only there, in Israel, but also here, in our country, and in our minds, emotions and souls. So with all the great things that have happened to Adath Israel this year, for which we are immensely grateful, we also have to figure out how and what has changed in our connection with our people and with Israel.

With that spiritual exercise in mind, I'd like to leave you with four questions to facilitate this journey of revisiting and finding deeper meaning:

~ How have my personal values, my perspectives and my relationship with Israel been affected by the events of October 7th?

~ What opportunities can I find to engage in dialogue with Israeli individuals or organizations to better

understand the current situation and have an informed and empathetic grasp of the reality in Israel?

 \sim What are the ways I can support efforts related to hostages and their families, and peace and reconciliation between Israel and its neighbors, through my personal actions or advocacy?

 \sim Through what channels can I form positive, meaningful and joyous connections with Israel?

I personally see the last question as particularly important, as it is fundamental that our relationship with Israel, like our relationship with Judaism, comes from a place of meaning and positivity. Being Jewish is more than fighting those who hate us, albeit this is part of it too. Loving Israel is more than October 7th, even though this is, unfortunately, part of it too.

May we grow deeper and have a more meaningful relationship with our being Jewish and the state of Israel.


