A Message from the Jewish Coaches Association Applicable for the Season

Last month, I wrote about a historic season in college basketball with three prominent Jewish head coaches. All three of those head coaches ended up leading their teams to the Final Four in San Antonio and one, Florida's Todd Golden, even won the national championship.

What most people don't understand about the Final Four is that it's more than just three basketball games. It's almost a full week of activities that include, among other things, a national coaches convention, USA Basketball training camp, and a variety of other conferences, meetings, and exhibits all in the same city.

I spent five days in San Antonio, and while the vast majority of that time was spent on various work obligations, I was able to attend the annual Jewish Coaches Association breakfast. It was my first time attending the event and was pleasantly surprised to find over 300 people there, the vast majority of whom were Jewish college coaches or people like myself who work in college basketball.

During that breakfast, Auburn head coach Bruce Pearl was presented with a lifetime achievement award. Pearl had helped found the organization twenty years earlier and had never missed the annual breakfast, even this year, when he would coach his team in the Final Four just ten hours later.

Pearl is known for being very vocal about his beliefs. He's a dynamic speaker, as you might expect from a coach, and clearly knows how to engage his audience. I've heard my share of coaches make speeches over the years, so admittedly I wasn't especially moved initially, but ultimately, he got me too.

What I was able to relate to was the sentiment that he closed with, which was to encourage everyone in the room to try to do more.

To give more...

Love more...

Lead more...

Be more ethical...

Essentially to recommit themselves to living the most principled, meaningful life possible. That even in times like these, or maybe especially in times like these, when so many people seem to think the worst of us for no reason beyond their own ignorance or prejudice, it was incumbent on us as Jews to live out the values that so many of us have been raised on.

A few days later, I was back home listening to the Passover Siyyum and it occurred to me that while this theme and message was valuable at any time of year, it was especially fitting at this time of year.

What does it mean to be the first born? I was always taught it meant setting the example.

Phishing Awareness: Avoid Taking the Bait

Every month or so it seems, scammers send out emails pretending to be from

Rabbi Nelly or a member of the Board. Below are some tips on how to avoid getting snagged by one of these phishing expeditions.

Common warning signs of phishing include:

- Unfamiliar greeting or tone
- Unsolicited messages
- Grammar and spelling errors
- Sense of urgency
- Suspicious links or attachments
- Requests for personal information
- Inconsistencies in email addresses, links, etc.
- Unusual requests
- Alerts that you've won something

Please remember: No one from Adath Israel will ever ask you for personal information or financial assistance via an email. If you have *any* question, do not respond to the email. Contact the person it claims to be from via a trusted method. DO NOT use any email, website, or phone number included in the suspicious message. If it is spam, please report it to your email provider.

Please do not use the diagonal parking spaces behind the church

In order to respect O.I.C.'s property rights, the synagogue has stopped using those spaces and will paint over them as soon as possible, turning them into a right of way from our remaining spaces to the exit onto William Street. The new Kiddush menus will be prepared and tastefully arranged by the Crown Supermarket in West Hartford. Please call the synagogue office at 860-346-4709 at least a week in advance to make ordering and pick-up arrangements with the office administrator.

The following is a breakdown of the new menus and costs for a Shabbat Morning Kiddush:

Traditional Kiddush (up to 15 people): \$150 (16-30 people): \$225

Bagels, tuna salad, egg salad, cuke, tomato, & onion platter, lox spread, plain & chive cream cheese, fruit salad, pastry, cold & hot drinks

Deluxe Kiddush (up to 15 people): \$225 (16-30 people): \$350

Bagels, tuna salad, egg salad, lox & sliced veggie platter, whitefish salad, plain & chive cream cheese, sesame noodles, kugel, fruit salad, pastry, cold & hot drinks

Friday Night Oneg Shabbat (15 people): \$54

Pretzels, fruit, M&M's, pastry, cold & hot drinks

Prices for both a Kiddush and/or an Oneg Shabbat will be adjusted if there is a larger group in attendance for special life cycle events (Bar/Bat Mitzvah, baby naming, or wedding, etc.).

Of course, you can always purchase the food, bring it to the synagogue and do the set up yourself while also following the synagogue's Kashrut guidelines. Some assistance may be available on the day of your Kiddush.
